

school and then was home-schooled, learning carpentry from his father in order to develop a future useful trade in his spoverty-stricken country. In his early teens he entered San Salvador's seminary and then enrolled in the Gregorian Uni- 🖇 versity in Rome. Completing his degree in theology, Romero was ordained a priest in 1942 and returned to El Salvador 🖇 \$the following year. He quickly set about assisting in building the cathedral and forming an Alcoholics Anonymous sassociation. Becoming the Rector of a Seminary in San Salvador and serving the Archbishop, Romero met with much criticism for his conservative views which only worsened after he was chosen as the Bishop in a rural area of San Salvador in 1975. Named Archbishop of San Salvador two years later. Romero strongly objected to the abuse of human rights and he took it upon himself to protest in a non-violent way the issues of social injustice and poverty. Romero was 🖇 known for his weekly sermons that were broadcast on the radio, with the intention of educating people about basic hu- $\check{\mathbb{X}}$ man rights and letting them know of the oppression people faced every day. Tensions only mounted as leftist opponents \S of the country's military government continued their attack on Church ideas and members. In March 1980, following a 🖇 $\$ radio broadcast of his Sunday sermon, Romero was shot through the heart while celebrating Mass. His words enraged $\$ El Salvador's brutal regime as he pleaded for justice and the laying down of arms.

Many remember Oscar Romero as a supporter of liberation theology which he said was of two kinds: the § Catholic vision and the Marxist belief. The Archbishop openly announced that he supported the Catholic idea, but not \$the other. His spiritual ideals embraced love for the Church of Rome, finding God in others, and a preferential option \S for the poor. The liberation Romero sought was and is at the heart of what it means to follow Christ. Faithfulness to God means challenging those approaches, ideals, and systems that impede the love we must have for one another – and \$\for \text{God}. for God.

On October 14, the canonization of St. Oscar Romero will be an occasion that, in the words of Pope Francis, not acknowledges his personal courage and holiness but also remembers his companions who, like him, have suffered tyrdom for the sake of the kingdom of God.
