

Next year, Bishops from around the world will answer the call of Pope Francis to meet in Rome for the "Synod on Synodality".

#### What is a Synod?

A Synod is a council of the Church, usually covened to decide an issue of doctrine, administration or application. The word synod is from the Greek sinodos meaning "assembly" or "meeting" and is similar to the Latin concilium meaning "council". Sometimes the phrase "general synod" or "general council" refers to an ecumenical council, like the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965).

### What is Synodality?

In the words of Pope Francis, a synodal Church is a "listening Church knowing that listening is more than feeling. It is a mutual listening in which everyone has something to learn. We must all listen to the Holy Spirit, the spirit of Truth to know what the Spirit is saying to the Church. [...] This is what the Lord expects from the Church of the third millennium." (Address at the commemoration of the 50th anniversary of the Synod of Bishops, 17 October 2015) Synodality provides opportunities to listen to the Holy Spirit and the People of God in order to discern together and walk forward on a common path, accompanying each other on the spiritual journey as we live out our missionary call to personal discipleship with our Lord.

### What is the goal of this Synod?

The objective of this Synodal Process is not to provide a temporary or one-time experience of synodality, but rather to provide an opportunity for the entire People of God to discern together how to move forward on the path towards being a more synodal Church in the long-term. Pope Francis characterizes the two interrelated goals of this process of listening: "to listen to God, so that with Him we may hear the cry of His people; to listen to His people until we are in harmony with the will to which God calls us."

Pope Francis and Archbishop Perez invites **YOU** to participate in the preparatory process for the upcoming Synod of Bishops by attending our next Parish engagement session, **Wednesday**, **March 23rd**, **7:00—8:30 pm** in the Religious Education Center (cafeteria), where you will become part of the process. If you are a seamstress, or if you can measure, cut, pin, or iron, we need YOU!





Teaching children in the PREP program brings to the catechist an even deeper understanding of the Catholic Faith. To teach someone is to add a deeper dimension of learning for oneself. In 1972, the National Conference of Bishops published a pamphlet entitled, "TO TEACH AS JESUS DID." I still refer to this document as a resource. The information is as current as any newly published work as it stresses the need for parents and catechists to understand that there is a collaboration that must take place for success. The religious truths must be communicated in a relevant manner with accurate information to integrate the religious truths with the values needed in life. In this document, there were references of the importance of the role of parents as the first religious educators of their children. And this year, while still dealing with the COVID 19 pandemic, the parents continued to be challenged to do just that by teaching the grade level curriculum whenever the child was unable to attend the in person sessions.

I write often of the meaning of a catechist, and today I would like you to reflect on the words because they apply to anyone who imparts the Catholic doctrine to children whether in a classroom setting, in the car, at the kitchen table or on the many community sport fields.

"A catechist is a person of faith, hope and love attached to arms and legs with aches, and pains, family duties and not enough time. A catechist is an ordinary person who is extraordinary because he or she teaches as Jesus did. A catechist is faithful to the past, open to the future, but especially dedicated to deepening the faith of the present generation." A catechist at St. John the Evangelist is one who follows the guidelines as set forth by the Archdiocese of Philadelphia adding their creativity, knowledge, and personality to each lesson. And all of you who assist are to be commended as well.

Our dedicated catechists are willing to make the effort to plan and then present the tenets of our Catholic faith to the students. There is always room for more catechists or volunteers, so if you feel that your talents can be shared with the students while spreading the Good News of the Gospel, then the PREP family welcomes you.

For the upcoming year, we are inviting all to be catechists and the people of faith who are willing to witness their love of the Catholic faith and teach the tenets of our beautiful faith.
