


From left to right: Bishop Keith Chylinski, Bishop Efren Esmilla and Bishop Christopher Cooke

Most Rev. Keith J. Chylinski currently serves as the Rector of Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary; He is 52 years old, born July 23, 1971 and was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of by Cardinal Justin Rigali on May 19, 2007. He is a graduate of Conestoga High School in Berwyn, and earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Temple University. While studying at the Seminary, he earned a Master of Divinity Degree in 2006 and a Master of Arts Degree in 2007.

Most Rev. Efren V. Esmilla currently serves as the Pastor of Saint James Parish in Elkins Park. He earned a Bachelor of Science Degree from San Beda College in Manila, The Philippines, in 1984. While studying at the Seminary, he earned a Master of Divinity Degree in 1992. He is 61 years old, born June 18, 1962 and was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia in 1993 by Cardinal Anthony Bevilacqua. He served as Regional Dean of Deanery 12 (Lower Northeast Philadelphia) from 2017 to 2022; adjunct Spiritual Director at Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary from 2017 to 2020; and Parochial Administrator of Saint Martin of Tour Parish (Philadelphia) from May 2021 to October 2021.

Most Rev. Christopher R. Cooke currently serves as the Dean of Men at Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary; He is 50 years old, born on November 8, 1973 and grew up in Saint Vincent de Paul Parish (Richboro). Prior to entering the program of priestly formation at Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary, he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Chemical Engineering from the University of Delaware in 1996. While studying at the Seminary, he earned a Master of Divinity Degree in 2005 and a Master of Arts Degree in 2006 and was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese in 2006 by Cardinal Justin Rigali.


